Dressage Finals at NewVenue to their wellbeing, US Equestrian has partnered

The 2025 US Dressage Finals presented by Adequan® will be held October 30 through November 2 at a new venue, World Equestrian Center (WEC) in Wilmington, Ohio. Verden, Germany – Two U.S. combinations gained valuable experience at the 2025 FEI WBFSH Dressage World Breeding Championships for Young Horses, held at the Turniergelände Verden in Verden, Germany. Hope Cooper and O Romeo S represented the U.S. in the six-year-old division, while Rebecca Rigdon and Stay Cool competed in the five-year-old division.

"I was super happy with our riders and horses. Hope [Cooper] and O'Romeo S made it straight into the Final out of 40 combinations in the first qualifier." said Chef d'Equipe and Technical Advisor Christine Traurig. "Rebecca [Rigdon] and Stay Cool did well also. As he matures I am sure he will do very well as a sixyear-old and we'll see them competing at WBC again. Both riders came home feeling inspired and motivated by the quality of the horses and riders they competed with and against and it shows how important it is for U.S. riders to have that experience in Europe."

US Equestrian announced the 2026 USEF Grand Prix Dressage National Championship will take place at World Equestrian Center (WEC) in Ocala, Fla., from May 13-17, 2026. The USEF Grand Prix Dressage National Championship will OPENER Del Mar, CA USA offer the opportunity for qualified combinations to test themselves in the exciting atmosphere of the Grand Arena at WEC - Ocala and compete for the title of the 2026 USEF Dressage Grand Prix Champion.

"It was important for us to make our Grand Prix National Championship a standalone event, as it should be one of the most highlighted events for the qualified combinations. It's also our intention to make it part of our selection process for the World Championships," said Chef d'Equipe Christine Traurig. "It is essential we see the top combinations on the same field of play with the same panel of judges in a comparable setting to what our experience will feel like in Aachen, Germany, at the Championships.

WEC is uniquely positioned to deliver an unforgettable championship experience for competitors, horses, and fans alike. We look forward to welcoming the equestrian community to Ocala and celebrating the best in U.S. dressage."

The qualification period for the championship will begin on September 1, 2025, and combinations vying for the championship must earn required scores at FEI events.

Crozet, France Dressage European Championships at JIVA Hill

I am hooked. Always a treat to watch the best of the best. I met 2 friends in Europe to watch the European Dressage Championships. This event proved to have many firsts. First time it was held in France, first time at a private resort and the First time for Belgium to win Gold!

This show did not disappoint. The first 2 days we watched 62 Grand Prix Riders from all over Europe in the team competition. There was not a bad seat in the house. The venue was small and intimate. We were keeping score on the teams and it was so tight up until the last moment which made it so very exciting. The riders were so good that the tiniest mistake could cost a placing. (the results are posted everywhere so I won't go thru the list)

The warm-up arena was like a who's who event. How often can you see, Carl Hester, Charlotte Fry, Ingrid Klimke, Isabelle Worth in the same arena warming up together. It doesn't get much better. We also were impressed with a guy on a black stallion from Belgum in the warm-up. Little did we know he would be making history.

After two days of Grand Prix (and several glasses of wine) it was time to watch the top 32 riders vie for the Grand Prix Special. We had learned a lot about the guy on the black stallion – Justin. I guess our eyes are well trained as he managed to capture the top placing in the special. His ride was lovely to watch. There was truly a special partnership and a lot of trust between the two.

After three days of riding, there was a down day. It was nice to have a break and see the sights with my friends, Brent Hicks and Cindy Bennett. We went to a beautiful Swiss town and toured a Chateau in Gruyere – yes like the cheese and we had our share of cheese. We also were fascinated with the cows in the countryside. They all wear bells about their neck. So if you drive slowly by and roll down your window, you can hear the chiming of cow bells. We had so much fun chasing down the sound of cowbells and finding the cows. Well two of us had so much fun. Brent was trying not to know us. (I think you had to be there)

We also toured a chocolate factory – Cailler's. After the tour you get to sample all the different types. It was amazing.

To end our day – we drove along Lake Genova and stopped for a walk along the lake and dinner. We were a bit late for dinner and the only thing left was fish and chips. But it wasn't just any fish and chips. The fish was perch from the lake and the French fries were from heaven and the wine was locally grown. What a treat. We were ready to end the day and look forward to the final day of competition.

But he recovers quickly and then the rest of the test was flawless. He finishes and it gives you goosebumps – it was lovely. He left the arena and had no idea he had won. When the final score was posted he was shocked. It was very emotional for everyone. He finished first with less than ½ of a % point. Belgium had double gold! It was wonderful to be there and see history in the making.

Needless to say we celebrated that evening in a tiny pizza ristorante -on the street. We voted Cindy to sit closest to the cars passing by!. What a fantastic time we had.

What more could you ask for. The beautiful French countryside, a view of Mount Blanc, fantastic French food and wine and all the talented riders and horses. It doesn't get much better.

ALYSSA DOVERSPIKE: The year of 2025 has sped past once againthe ever elusive Lamplight in Chicago was a goal in the far distance which quickly materialized and now sits in the past along with all the short and long term milestones that come with a year of training a developing horse. I consider myself extremely lucky to own the horse I went down centerline with this year at Festival. It is a mare I purchased at 2 weeks old and have developed along with my coaches Kathleen Raine and David Wightman. Every day on this particular horse is a great day for me. She has the talent for the big sport and the temperament to take you to the ends of the earth. Most years at lamplight we arrive with a gang of young horses throughout all the levels, however this year, my horse Dori was the only horse we pursued qualifying with in the Developing PSG.

It's special to have one horse to focus on. Horse shows rarely have downtime when you travel with an entourage of four legged friends, so to spend that one on one time with Dori this year meant a lot to me and strengthened our connection that I already considered so unbreakable. Lamplight always presents quite the roller coaster of possibilities and the more years you participate, the more true that theory becomes! Our first day was not our best, in fact it was the worst score I've ever received in any level with this horse! What a day! Full of tension and small mistakes... hind sight is 20/20 and it is helpful to tap into that quickly! We had a day in between to figure out how to come back to each other and with the help and positivity of everyone around us we accomplished a major come back. We were second to start in the class in the Final and held onto first place until the top two from the day of the preliminary competed which ended up putting us third for the Final test. This ended with a 7th place overall finish for our year of 2025- and although I always go into this show with the ambitions of a better performance, I have learned so much from a come back. And I am beyond thrilled to take my best friend home

I can't thank CDS enough for the support they have shown throughout the years of sending our horses across the country to compete against the top horses in the US. It is a pleasure to represent such a great state of horses, riders, and trainers.

HEATHER KENNEDY: It was such an honor to attend The Festival of Champions in Chicago! The road to qualify was vigorous for my horse, Dr. Davidoff, and my husband and myself. We made a big jump from fourth level the previous year to doing PSG and I1 in CDI's. I'm very proud of the progress Davi (Dr. Davidoff) made throughout 2025.

Unfortunately at The Festival we had many unexpected mistakes. We did not bring our A game. We got it together a bit in the freestyle to land in the middle of the pack.

Overall it was a great experience! I met new friends and got to know many of my fellow competitors. I had a lot of unexpected support from many of these people as well as from long time friends and colleagues. We are grateful to all those individuals who helped us make this trip happen. A travel grant from our California Dressage Society was greatly appreciated. We are continuing our work towards Grand Prix with the expert guidance of Steffen Peters. Hopefully we see everyone in the GP ring in the future!

LILIAN RAMIREZ: My time at the Festival was truly unforgettable. After qualifying with Christiane Noelting's Fuerst Felix at the 2024 Region 7 Championships for the 13-U equitation with a score of 86%, my family and I were inspired to pursue the 2025 U.S. Festival of Champions. We focused on the FEI Children's class and, within four months, secured a top five position with an average score of 71%. Competing at Lamplight alongside the nation's top riders was an incredible opportunity, and despite feeling inexperienced, we finished fourth in both the DSE and FEI Children's divisions, achieving a personal best average score of 73%. Qualifying with Felix was particularly meaningful given my previous successes at various CDS championships, where I progressed from training through second level, bringing him from a young 6-year-old to a strong, experienced 8-year-old. At Lamplight, I connected with junior and young riders from California and other regions across the country. Overall, participating in the Festival of Champions taught us the importance of living in the moment and building our experience on a national stage. I am incredibly grateful to have been a part of this event!

JACLYN PEPPER: Festival of Champions 2025 was an unforgettable experience for us. We made a last-minute decision to try for the Developing Grand Prix—and to our surprise, we qualified ranked 6th. Finishing fourth overall was incredible, and achieving that on a self-trained, Americanbred horse made it all the more special. A heartfelt thank you to CDS for your support—we truly felt the love all the way in Chicago.

CDS would like to recognize and reward CDS members for their accumulative achievements. CDS has created the GEM Rider Award pin.

RUBY ~ Training, First, Second Levels - 2 scores of 60% or better at each level. Total of 6 scores.

SAPPHIRE ~ Third, Fourth Levels - 2 scores of 60% or better at each level. Total of 4 scores.

DIAMOND ~ FEI Levels (Prix St Georges, Intermediaire, Grand Prix) 1 score of 60% or better at each level. Total of 3 scores.









PLATES PLAQUES

More recognition for success.

A plate is awarded to a CDS member the first time he/she earns scores of 60% or better at Introductory C Level or above in a single show season. A personalized wall plaque is available for purchase for mounting the plates.



Henry Burchard

Memorial Trophy - awarded to the owner/rider on a single horse receiving the highest number of scores of 60% or better during the competition year.







HIGH SCORE PONY

The CDS Pony Award is a ribbon that goes to the high scoring pony at each CDS recognized show. All pony riders must inform show management that they would like to be eligible for the pony award. CDS will also offer a Year End Award for the overall highest scoring pony Training and above.

HIGH SCORE PARA

The CDS PARA Rider Award is a ribbon that goes to the high scoring PARA rider at each CDS recognized show. All riders must inform show management that they would like to be eligible for the award. CDS will also offer a Year End Award for the overall highest scoring Training and above.

SPORT HORSE

Scoring will be on a point system: 5pts-1st, 4pts-2nd, 3pts-3rd, 2pts-4th, 1pt-5th. If there are fewer than three in the class, the point system changes to: 2pts-1st, 1pt-2nd. Classes to count: yearling filly, yearling colt, yearling gelding, two-year-old filly, two-year-old colt, two-year-old gelding, three-year-old filly, three-year-old gelding, mature mare and mature stallion.

A CDS member becomes a Qualified Riding Member the first time he/she earns a score of 50% or better at First Level or above.

HORSE PERFORMANCE

Horse Performance Awards are based strictly on the scores a horse achieves over time and need not be earned in one year. These Awards may be earned at any level, Training through FEI level.

Horse Performance Awards may also be earned for young horses competing in any USEF 4/5/6-year-old young horse class. level.




